Easter Story Wheel Template

Items needed:

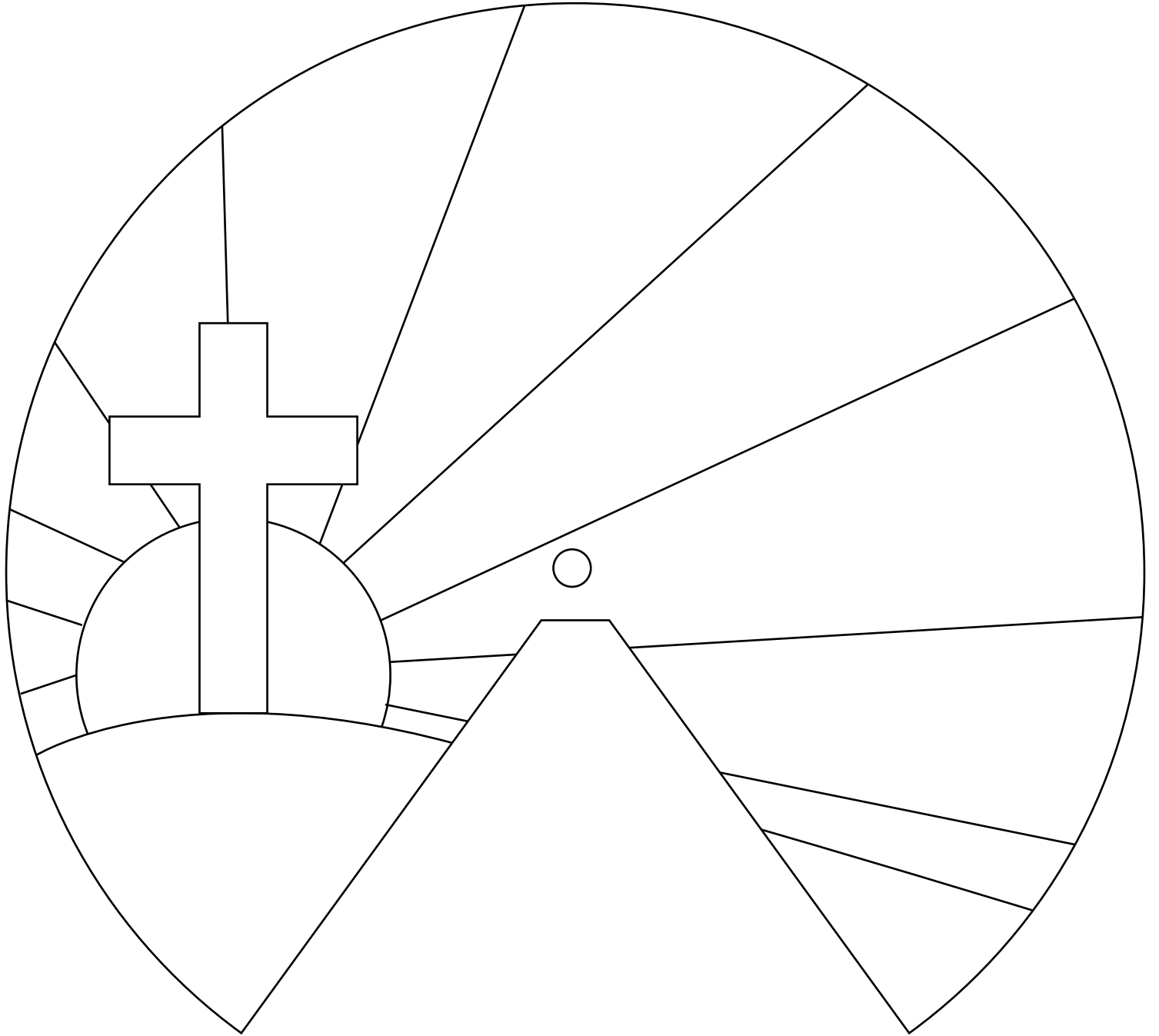
- White cardstock paper or plain paper
- Colored pencils or markers
- Paper fastener
- Hole punch
- Pencil
- Scissors

Instructions for Creating the Easter Story Spinner:

1. Print the story wheel and cover on white cardstock paper or plain paper and color the story wheel using your preferred colored pencils or markers.
2. Carefully cut out the story wheel and cover.
3. Use a hole punch to create a hole in the middle of the cover where indicated.
4. Next, utilize a pencil to make a hole in the middle of the story wheel.
5. Attach the story wheel and cover together by fastening them with a paper fastener.







Easter Story Egg Template

Items needed:

- White cardstock paper or plain paper
- Colored pencils or markers
- A dozen plastic eggs
- Clean egg carton
- Tape or glue
- Scissors

Instructions for Creating the Easter Story Egg Template:

1. Print and color numbers and corresponding cards.
2. Carefully cut out numbers and corresponding cards.
3. Tape or glue numbers to plastic eggs. Each numbered egg represents a key event in the Easter story.
4. Insert corresponding cards in to numbered eggs.
5. Count back 12 days from Resurrection Sunday. Begin opening an egg a day until the Resurrection. Use the Resurrection story script to tell the story of Easter.



Resurrection Story



Palm Sunday:

Jesus enters Jerusalem, and people welcome him with palm branches.



Last Supper:

Jesus shares a special meal with his disciples, giving them bread and wine.



Garden of Gethsemane:

Jesus prays while his disciples sleep, knowing he will soon be arrested.



Betrayal:

Judas, one of Jesus' disciples, betrays him with a kiss, leading to his arrest.



Trial before Pilate:

Jesus is questioned by Pilate, the Roman governor, but he is found innocent.



Crucifixion:

Jesus is nailed to a cross and dies, forgiving those who crucify him.



Burial:

Jesus' body is placed in a tomb, and a large stone is rolled in front of it.



Guarded Tomb:

Roman soldiers guard the tomb to prevent anyone from stealing Jesus' body.



Resurrection:

On the third day, the stone is rolled away, and Jesus rises from the dead.



Empty Tomb:

Jesus' followers find the tomb empty and are told by angels that he has risen.



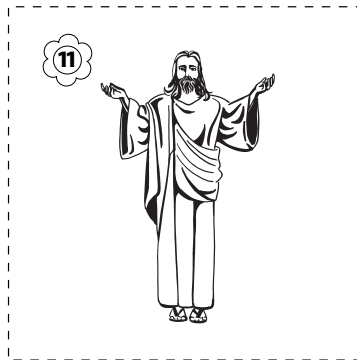
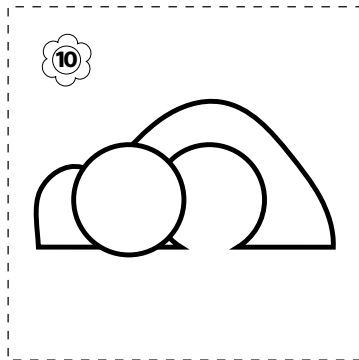
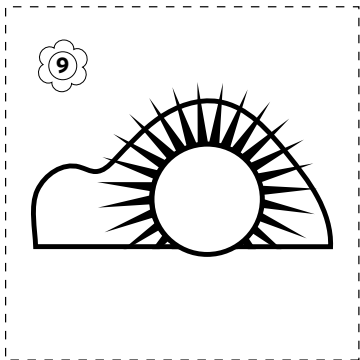
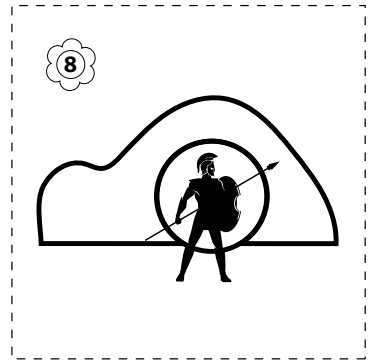
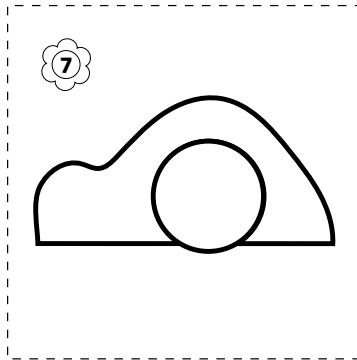
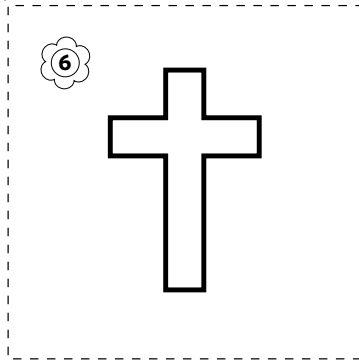
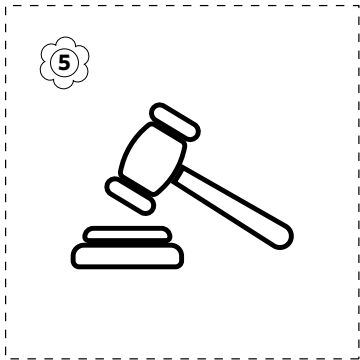
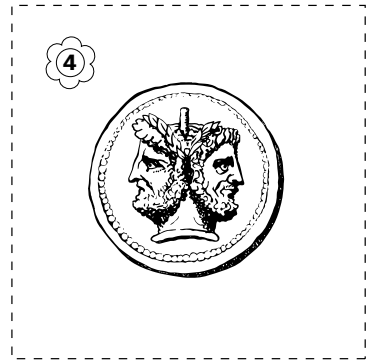
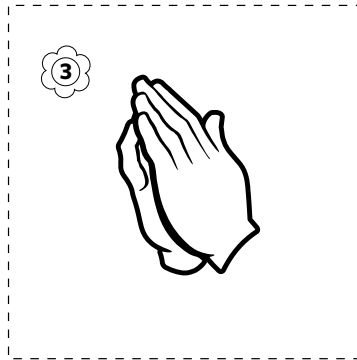
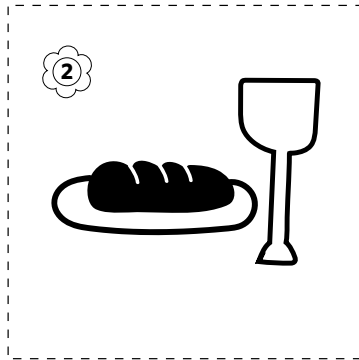
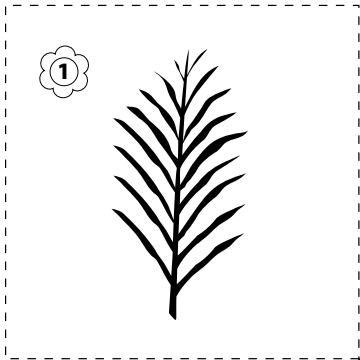
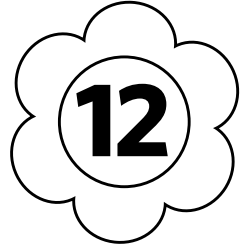
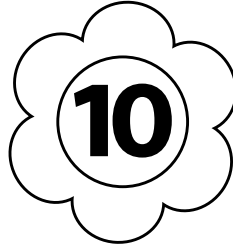
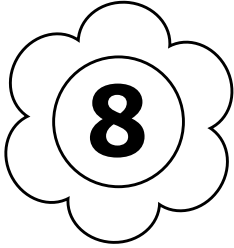
Appearances:

Jesus appears to his disciples and others, showing them that he is alive.



Ascension:

Forty days after his resurrection, Jesus ascends into heaven, promising to always be with his followers.



Easter Tomb Rolls

Ingredients:

1 can (8 oz) refrigerated crescent roll dough
8 large marshmallows
2 tablespoons butter, melted
2 tablespoons granulated sugar
1 tablespoon ground cinnamon

Instructions:

Preheat your oven to 375°F (190°C). Line a baking sheet with parchment paper or lightly grease it.

In a small bowl, mix together the sugar and cinnamon. Set aside.

As you begin, reflect on the story of Jesus' burial. Jesus, who was without sin, died on the cross and was buried in a tomb. (John 19:38-42)

Separate the crescent roll dough into triangles according to the package instructions. These represent the linen cloths that Jesus was wrapped in before burial. (John 19:40)

Roll each marshmallow in the melted butter until coated, symbolizing the anointing oil used to prepare Jesus' body for burial. (John 19:39)

Next, roll the butter-coated marshmallows in the cinnamon-sugar mixture. This represents the spices that were used to anoint Jesus' body. (John 19:40)

Place one coated marshmallow on the wide end of each crescent roll triangle, symbolizing Jesus being placed in the tomb. (Luke 23:50-53)

Carefully wrap the dough around each marshmallow, making sure to seal the edges completely to represent the sealed tomb.



This symbolizes how the tomb was sealed with a large stone. (Matthew 27:60)

Place the wrapped marshmallows seam side down on the prepared baking sheet.

As you place the rolls in the oven, remember that Jesus' followers were filled with sorrow and confusion after His death. (Luke 24:17-21)

Bake in the preheated oven for 10-12 minutes, or until the rolls are golden brown and the marshmallows have melted completely.

While the rolls are baking, consider the anticipation and uncertainty felt by Jesus' followers during the time between His death and resurrection. (Matthew 27:62-66)

Allow the rolls to cool for a few minutes before serving, as the marshmallow filling will be very hot.

When you cut into the roll, you'll find that the marshmallow inside has melted, leaving an "empty tomb" representation. This signifies the glorious truth of Jesus' resurrection from the dead on the third day. (Luke 24:1-7)

As you enjoy these symbolic treats with friends and family, take a moment to reflect on the true meaning of Easter and the hope we have because of Jesus' victory over death. (1 Corinthians 15:54-57)

Enjoy making and sharing these Empty Tomb Rolls as you celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ!
